SAUERKRAUT AND OTHER RAW/LIVE TREATS NOW AVAILABLE IN BULK

Good-Food-Live, a small local operation making simple living foods in bulk, has started to sell some of their products at growers market. Check out the jollykraut (local cabbage sauerkraut), jollycrackers (flax-sauerkraut crackers), halva-live (sweet sesame confection), and carobella (sweet sugar-free carob/sesame spread, replacing nutella). "We are a small production based at Lost Valley intentional community (near Dexter). All of our ingredients are organic and vegan. We use manual machines (like human powered graters and grinders) and dehydrators and we make special effort in using local ingredients - like Oregon flax seeds, Eugene-made tahini, and cabbage directly from the farm.
